SECTION 2024 RULES

All entries must be done online via Showday - <https://showday.online/> in the first instance or on the official 2024 Entry Form.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: 5PM, FRIDAY 25 OCTOBER 2024

- **ENTRY FEE:** Minimum fee of \$10 per exhibitor – regardless of number of entries in this section including a mixture of classes i.e. cooking, sewing and or craft etc.
Entry fee must be paid at time of entering on Showday. NO ENTRY FEE FOR STUDENT'S CLASSES.
- **PRIZE MONEY** - There will be no set prize money in these classes, however, sponsored product and prizes may be awarded.
- Exhibitors are responsible for entry in the correct class, and no exhibit may be entered in more than one class.
- All entries must be the work of the Exhibitor.
- **All entries must be clearly identified with a FIRMLY ATTACHED tie or adhesive label, with exhibitors name and class number on it.**
- Entries will be judged at the time and place determined by the Creative Handmade Section Committee.
- Entries will be judged without wrapping.
- Entries received after the time specified will not be judged but may be displayed at the discretion of the Stewards.
- The Association will not be responsible for loss, damage or mis-delivery of any entry.
- If the Exhibitor requires work returned by mail an addressed envelope and return postage must be provided.
- Individual entry form per exhibitor **MUST** be filled in.
- Engraving of trophies/cups/shields/trays to be at the expense of the recipient.
- **POINTS** 1st 3 points, 2nd 2points, 3rd 1 point. Less than 4 entries in any one class only half points will be awarded.

Champion. Supreme Champion – A champion will be awarded in the Needlework/Handcraft, Cooking, and Photography sections, which will then be judged as “2024 Creative Handmade Section Supreme Champion” Winner and the “2024 Creative Handmade Section Runner Up **MARIE BISHELL MEMORIAL TRAY**” - will be awarded for the most accumulated points over the cooking, needlework and Handcraft, and photography sections. Winner to receive a Voucher and our Runner Up to receive a voucher.

ENTRIES NEED TO BE DELIVERED AS FOLLOWS:

- ALL ENTRIES except cooking and produce to be delivered to the Committee Room, Downstairs of Pavilion at A & P Park or posted to PO Box 115, Blenheim by 5.00pm on Wednesday 6th November 2024.
- All COOKING and PRODUCE entries to be delivered to Committee Room, downstairs at A & P Pavilion between 5.00pm and 6.30pm on Thursday 7th November 2024 or between 8.00am and 12noon to the Creative/Handmade Marquee on Friday 8th November 2024.
- FLORAL - Entries for the floral section only, classes 150 - 155 will close Thursday November 7th 5pm. All other entries to be delivered by 12 noon Friday November 8th to the creative handmade marquee.
- **STUDENT** entries are to be delivered at the times stated above. Students may enter individually or through their school classes.

- Entries to be collected from the marquee between 10.00am and 5.00pm on Sunday 10th November 2024 unless prior arrangements have been made.

Recipe:

450g (1lb) Sultanas	350g (12 oz) Flour
225g (8 oz) Butter	1 teaspoon Baking Powder
225g (8 oz) Sugar	1 teaspoon Lemon Essence
3 Eggs	

Method:

Cover sultanas with water, boil 15 minutes and drain.

Add butter and when melted, add sugar mixed with the eggs, then sift in flour and baking powder. Mix in essence and bake in a 200 mm (8 inch) tin at 160°C (132°F) about 1¹/₂ hours.

Class 116 Sponge Cake – Recipe provided – whole sponge to be judged

1 mixture only, No jam filling, no dusting with icing sugar

Ingredients:

- 3 eggs separated –and they MUST be at room temperature
- pinch salt
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1/2 cup caster sugar
- 2/3 cup cornflour
- 1 slightly rounded tablespoon plain flour
- 1 level teaspoon baking powder

Method:

Pre-heat oven to 190degC. Line tin with paper, spray with oil and dust with cornflour

Beat egg whites with salt until soft peaks form.

Gradually beat in sugar a little at a time then continue to beat until stiff.

Add egg yolks and vanilla essence, beat until combined.

Sift together 3 times cornflour, flour and baking powder then add to egg mixture.

Carefully and lightly fold mixture together using a wooden spoon or spatula. Do not stir.

Divide batter between two greased and lightly floured 20cm round cake tins and bake 18-20mins.
